The reading program will begin meeting Tuesday, June 11 at 3:00 to 4:30 pm in BE 324. We will meet for 7 consecutive Tuesdays at that time and place. The last meeting will be Tuesday, July 23.

As noted in my previous email in this regard, the readings/discussions are to give people a sense of the confluence of economic thought, economic history, and economic policy.

Many of the readings are from Lawrence H. White, *The Clash of Economic Ideas: The Great Policy Debates and Experiments of the Last Hundred Years*, Cambridge University Press, 2012. The book discusses many of the important debates in economic thought over the 20th century and how it has played out in history and policy. I have ordered copies of the book and it will be provided free of charge to participants. Pdfs of other readings also will be provided.

Refreshments (e.g, soft drinks, snacks, munchies, pizza) also will be provided at each of our meetings.

I have selected readings to supplement the White book. Some are complementary to the White chapters, and some are on additional, but broadly related, topics.
